Arizona COVID-19 cases

The Arizona Department of Health Services has reported 263,133 positive COVID-19 cases and 169,091 cases in Maricopa County as of Nov. 10, 2020. Out of the 2,224,904 COVID-19 tests completed to date in Arizona, 9.7% have tested positive for the virus. Percent positive is the number of people with a positive test result, out of all the people COVID-19 tested completed in Arizona.

In Maricopa County, 13,943 patients (8%) have been admitted to a hospital and 1,498 (1%) admitted to an ICU since the county began collecting data on Jan. 22. Hospitalizations related to COVID-19 continue to increase across Arizona.

Verteran's Day – November 11

As we approach Veterans Day, we would like to take a moment to recognize the significance of this special holiday. It is a time to honor the brave men and women in our armed forces and to thank them for their service to our country, and pay special tribute to the veterans working at all of our Abrazo hospitals and affiliated entities. The history of Veteran's Day traces back to World War I, which formally ended on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. Veterans Day was first proclaimed in November of 1919 by President Woodrow Wilson. He marked the day with these words: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations." In 1954 Armistice Day became Veterans Day in legislation marking November 11 a day to honor American veterans of all wars.

Please join us in recognizing all those who serve or have served in the armed forces, for their sacrifice defending our nation's freedom.
