Arizona COVID-19 cases

The Arizona Department of Health Services has reported 189,443 positive COVID-19 cases and 127,128 cases in Maricopa County as of Aug. 12, 2020. Out of the 1,284,786 COVID-19 tests completed to date in Arizona, 12.3% have tested positive for the virus. Percent positive is the number of people with a positive test result, out of all the people COVID-19 tested completed in Arizona.

In Maricopa County, 13,444 patients (11%) have been admitted to a hospital and 1,092 (1%) admitted to an ICU since the county began collecting data on Jan. 22. People aged 65 or older or those who have at least one chronic health condition make up 42% of those who have been hospitalized and 83% of deaths for COVID-19. Approximately 63% of all COVID-19 infections reported have been among those under 45 years old.

Infection prevention reminder

Our screening process at hospital entrances serve as a way to keep all who enter our hospitals safe and minimize risk of infection between staff. Below is a quick refresher on guidelines for screening at the facility entrances. A good practice is to remember to sanitize your hands and grab a facemask before getting your temperature taken.

Please remember the following:

- Allow 6 feet between you and the person in front of you
- Sanitize your hands
- If you do not have a mask on already, to don a mask carefully lift the top mask by the ear loop with the hand you just cleaned

Screeners

- Allow those you are screening time to don a mask. Even though you are masked, this
 practice is to further protect you.
- Be sure to ask about fever, cough or other change in health status. While most, but not all, of those you screen are employees and providers who know the symptoms and stay home if they are sick, it is still a good practice to ask.
