

Arizona COVID-19 cases

The Arizona Department of Health Services has reported 218,507 positive COVID-19 cases and 141,856 cases in Maricopa County as of Sept. 30, 2020. Out of the 1,750,673 COVID-19 tests completed to date in Arizona, 10.4% have tested positive for the virus. Percent positive is the number of people with a positive test result, out of all the people COVID-19 tested completed in Arizona.

In Maricopa County, 14,433 patients (10%) have been admitted to a hospital and 1,363 (1%) admitted to an ICU since the county began collecting data on Jan. 22.

Flu shots

It's that time of year to get your annual flu shot. Protect your patients by protecting yourself against influenza. Please check with your campus Employee Health for vaccination schedules during October.
